“Jesus Our Savior”
Isaiah 53:12

Read Isaiah 52:13-15 and 53:1-12 and Matthew 27:27-66 before answering the following questions.

Introduction

In this three-part series we'll explore, from the Old Testament, three different facets that foreshadow the role of Jesus Christ as “our Lover”, “our Hope” and “our Savior”. The book of Hosea gives us an incredible picture of God's endless pursuit of His people not contingent on their response to Him.

Questions for Study

1. If you're participating in Brookside's 365 challenge, to this point in your reading, what have you learned about the human race that's not something to brag about? If you're not participating in this challenge, you can still answer this question. :)
2. The above verses from Isaiah 52 and 53 are prophetic of Jesus' crucifixion and exaltation. Who is Isaiah speaking for? Clue: He's speaking for more than one person.
3. Have you ever watched a movie that begins with the end of the story and then goes back and tells the entire story leading up to that point? How is this done in this passage of scripture? Why do you think God did it this way? (You might find these to be challenging questions to answer, but give it your best try.)
4. What do you learn about Jesus from Isaiah 52:13-15?
5. What do you learn about Jesus from Isaiah 53:2?
6. What do you learn about Jesus from Isaiah 53:3-5 and 7?
7. What do you learn about yourself from Isaiah 53:6?
8. What does the following phrase from Isaiah 53:11 mean?
“After he was suffered, he will see the light of life and be satisfied.”
9. How would you use this passage of scripture to share the gospel with another person?
