Going Public: BAPTISM

Context

This week we'll be taking a look at the topic of baptism. Baptism is an incredible celebration both for the person being baptized and for the church that is looking on. Whether you are in a place where baptism is a next step in your faith journey, or you've already been baptized, it is important to have a biblical understanding of why we do baptism as it can easily be misunderstood.

Questions for Study

- 1. Read Romans 6:3-6. Describe the picture that we get from this text. What does baptism demonstrate?
- 2. Have you been baptized? If so, when did it take place for you and what were the circumstances surrounding it?
- 3. Read Acts 2:38. What did Peter say to do before a person was to be baptized?
- 4. How was Jesus baptized (see Matthew 3:13-17)?
- 5. What is the pattern for how a person is baptized demonstrated in the New Testament (see Acts 8:26-38).
- 6. When a person is baptized, why is it a celebration? What all is being celebrated (see Eph 2:1-5)? What does baptism mean for the person being baptized? What does it mean for the church that is getting to watch?
- 7. Is it disobedient to not be baptized? Why?
- 8. What will baptism *not* do for a person? Why is this important to know?
- 9. How can a person have a relationship with Jesus (see Eph 2:8-9)?
- 10. If someone asked you when they should be baptized what would you say to them?
